In Japan, all 4,000 residents of Miyake Jima Island were evacuated from their homes in July and August 2000 after Mount Oyama erupted several times. Most were given such short notice that they had to leave all their belongings behind. More than a year later, some residents were allowed to return to the island to inspect their homes. However, they were informed that 10 they would not be able to move back in.

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
Despite such reports, volcanic power can also be a positive force. When volcanic ash breaks down, it forms a rich soil in which crops are able to flourish. These same crops provide food needed for human beings to survive. Volcanic steam is used to generate power and heat homes in some countries, 15 while volcanic rocks often contain precious metals such as gold.




