

I have had to help my friends from time to time. Three years ago, I had to help a friend who has a certain fear. This is the story of Enrique and how his life changed one Saturday morning in 2008.

While in the living room of his house, Enrique saw an enormous spider on his right shoe. Just as he thought that it was the biggest spider 5 he had seen in his life, the animal left its place on his shoe and slipped up his pants.

Nothing so terrifying had ever happened to him before. At that moment, he recalled two facts he had read in a National Geographic magazine - all spiders, even the smallest ones, carry poison and can 10 inject it and spiders only sting when they feel that their lives are in danger.

Looking at the size of the enormous spider, Enrique was certain that the spider must have plenty of poison in it. Hence, he thought the most sensible thing to do was to stand still, since the slightest movement 15 would result in the animal injecting him with a deadly dose of poison. He kept rigid for five to six hours, hoping that the spider would eventually leave but it did not. Despite his wife's pleas for him to abandon the plan, Enrique insisted on keeping stone still as long as needed.

Around two in the afternoon, his helpless wife called me in to see if 20 I could resolve the problem. I was a bit annoyed as I had to give up my only nap of the week. Once over at Enrique's house, I found him in a pathetic state. I knew I had to do something.

I searched frantically for a razor blade and newspapers. I took the razor blade and made a vertical slit downwards on his pants. I rolled-up 25 the newspaper, knocked the spider to the floor and killed it. To convince Enrique that the spider was actually dead, I carried it and threw it away.

Enrique let out a loud cry of relief after seeing the spider in the bin. He could not believe that it was finally over.

Father Alfonso Berrade had just finished a busy day and was sitting down with a cup of tea in his room across from San Clemente, Pisco's main church. As dusk gathered, he could hear the strains of a hymn echoing through the church where 500 people had gathered for a memorial service.

Suddenly as Father Berrade sipped his tea, the ground started to heave up and down furiously. Having lived through many earthquakes, the priest knew he had to take shelter. He rushed to the open door of his room and braced himself under the frame.

As the pounding grew harder and harder, Father Berrade could hear people inside the church screaming. Then everything was drowned out by the thundering sound of the 200-year-old structure crumbling.

First the roof fell in, then the walls collapsed, forming mountainous heaps of bricks, splintered beams and dust. The congregation had not rushed for the doors; they felt safe in the church as they knew it had survived the big 1730 earthquake.

As the up-and-down jackhammer shaking shifted to a violent back-and-forth swaying, Father Berrade braced himself under the doorjamb as best as he could. "Will it never end?" he thought.

A shower of bricks cascading down from the church struck Father Berrade in the chest, knocking him back into the room. "My time has come," he thought. "This is it."

When the shaking finally stopped, Father Berrade got up and made his way to the rubble where the door used to be. He was greeted by an unimaginable sight. Most of his beautiful church had collapsed, with only part of the walls and the dome still standing. As the earth continued to quiver with aftershocks, he feared the destruction was not over.

People began to pull themselves from the morass of stone and wood. Others partially buried, were clawing at the ground and pleading for help. Then all at once the scene came alive with young people, who had been in the town square when the earthquake hit, arriving at the church. Not waiting for orders, they dug at the heaps of debris with their bare hands, following every call and whimper for help.

By 4 am, more than nine hours after the earthquake, the voices beneath the rubble had fallen silent. In all, the volunteer brigade had saved 22 people from a site that would claim 115 lives.
