More than half of the people who took part in a survey by "The Straits Times" voted for Hainanese chicken rice as the most popular local dish of Singapore. The reason why they have chosen this dish is because it can be found in almost every hawker centre, food court, restaurant or coffee shop in Singapore.

Some have said that a plate of chicken rice is a meal in itself. It has flavoured rice, tender meat, slices of cucumber and a bowl of light soup. Therefore, it offers a more balanced diet than other well-liked dishes such as 'Laksa' and 'Nasi Lemak'. For as little as \$2 a plate at some stalls, it is also very affordable compared to other dishes such as chilli crabs.

However, not everyone may think that chicken rice has nutritional value. Cooked with lots of chicken oil, it is certainly not very healthy. Others protest that as its name suggests, it is not even Singaporean!

When asked to clarify, food experts said that chicken rice has changed from the original Hainanese version to become a version unique to Singapore. Chicken rice was brought to Singapore in the mid-1900s by Hainanese immigrants, many of whom worked as cooks. The Hainanese immigrants improved on the original dish of plain boiled chicken eaten with plain rice by adding local ingredients to cater to the local taste. The creation of a chilli sauce to complement it is also unique to our love for spices.
