The thought of palms, coconuts and canoes set you dreaming of balmy tropical isles. The silhouette of a palm-tree itself is enough to conjure up a picture of golden sands and blue skies by the shore of some distant, sundrenched, softly-lapping ocean.

There are palm trees in Europe and North America too but these 5 have been introduced from their original tropical home. The only true European palm is the palm of St Peter that grows along the balmy, exotic shores of the Mediterranean.

Despite their many varieties, all palms generally show a characteristically tall trunk which is strong, slender and marked with 'steps' all 10 the way up. These steps are really the marks left by the fallen leaves.

The old proverb 'he who plants the date palm, does not live to eat the fruit' refers to the slowness with which the date palm grows and bears fruit. The sweet, delicious flesh of the date is very wholesome and nourishing and can be kept for a long time. The fruits of the date palms are gathered in hanging clusters. Their flesh which is rich in vitamins makes them very nourishing. Date palms are widespread in North Africa, in the **oases** where there is water. They are able to bear tremendous heat but die when there is no moisture.

The coconut palm provides us with a fruit which is even more exotic than the date. The milky liquid that fills the nut and the sweet white pulp that we eat are parts of the seed which is protected on the outside by the tough shell. For the native, these fruits are an indispensable food and they are also used to make many things: some kinds of margarine, for instance, are often made from the oil which is extracted from the coconut pulp.

There are many other palms which provide oils, fibres, timber or 25 flour. Among these, the palm Phytelephs yields vegetable ivory for the making of buttons and many other objects that are familiar to us.

From the fruit of the oil palm, cultivated in Africa, Sumatra and Malaysia, oil is obtained for food and industrial purposes such as making soap and candles. Sago and tapioca come from several palms, chiefly the Metroxylon 30 sagu.
