Our environment is threatened by various factors from air and water pollution to deforestation, robbing us of precious natural resources. You can make a difference by caring for the environment today. Start with the basic three Rs – reduce, reuse and recycle – and you will find that even the little things go a long way.

Bring your own reusable bag with you when you go shopping. Plastic bags may be convenient, but they take a huge toll on the environment. As they take around 300 years to break down naturally, they are not easily disposed of and end up cluttering the landfill sites. Some end up polluting the oceans and killing marine life that get entangled in them.

Throwing a can into the recycling bin instead of the rubbish bin may seem like a small gesture, but in the long run, a lot of harm to the environment can be avoided. If thrown away and left in landfills, the aluminium can takes more than 400 years to naturally decompose and incinerating it releases toxins into the environment. So spare a thought for the 15 environment the next time you finish a can of **soft drink** – recycle **it**

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bill for the month. By saving energy, you reduce the impact on the 20 environment caused by the production of that energy. Greenhouse gases are released by burning fossil fuels to create energy. This is why Earth Hour is commemorated annually by turning off lights worldwide.

There are many things in life we take for granted and, as a result, end up wasting. Wasting paper, for example, will lead ro more trees being cut²⁵ down to produce more paper. Food wastage is also particularly prevalent in Singapore. A study by Nanyang Technological University (NTU) students in 2010 revealed that Singaporeans threw out about 600 million kg of food waste. When you consider the environmental impact food production has – meat and beef in particular have been blamed for contributing to global 30 warming – this figure is more than a little frightening. So be mindful of what you consume and make sure you do not make more food than you need.
