How did it all start? It all began last year when Minnal's mother decided she might want to climb the lofty Himalayas. An avid trekker, she asked both father and daughter if they were up for the challenge. This year, on 20 May, the trio flew to Nepal.

Minnal shared that most of the next eight days were spent hiking ten to fifteen kilometres from 8am to 6pm each day, with the help of three local guides and two porters. Luckily, she added, nobody fell ill with altitude sickness. She also said that she is thinking of conquering Everest in future.
