From Jesse Owens to Jim Thorpe, and from Mark Spitz to Michael Phelps, the Olympics have long been a source of inspirational, sports feel good stories.

One of those truly inspiring stories happened in the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona. Derek Redmond, a British sprinter, came into the Olympic games as a favourite to win the 400 metres. Feeling he was in the best shape of his life, despite some 8 operations on his Achilles tendons over the past 4 years, he was confident of his abilities. His father, Jim, who was attending the games, had high hopes. Derek and his father were very **tight**. Jim made it to most of Derek's races.

Derek won his heat in the quarter finals and posted the fastest time. In the semis, Derek got off to a good start. As he rounded the first bend in the track, Derek came up limping as his hamstring snapped. Feeling as if he had been shot, Derek came to a halt. His leg would not work properly. Track officials with stretchers approached him, but Derek waved them off.

Derek said in the The Guardian, "Everything I had worked for was finished. I hated everybody. I hated the world. I hated hamstrings. I hated it all. I felt so bitter that I was injured again. I told myself I had to finish. I kept hopping round. Then, with 100 metres to go, I felt a hand on my shoulder. It was my old man."

Derek hopped on one leg towards the finish line before his father pushed past security and came to his aid. Leaning on his father, they made it around the track. His father let Derek finish the last steps before the finish line on his own.

As Derek was aided in his race, the official record lists his attempt as "Did Not Finish." However, to the 65,000 fans in attendance, not only did he finish; he showed the true Olympic spirit. The crowd gave Derek and his father <u>a standing ovation</u>.

Over the course of his career, Derek had won many races, but he will always be best remembered for a race that he "did not finish."

In the year 1852, it was not a jet plane but a sea-tossed sailing vessel which brought the first valiant missionaries of a little band of nuns from France to journey's end in the Far East after a long weary voyage of six months. It was indeed a miracle that these nuns had made it as the first missionary trip to the East the year before was a failure. The head nun of | 5 the party died at sea, another caught brain fever and a third left on reaching Singapore. Only two nuns were left and another party had to be sent. Sister Mathilde was chosen as the Superior of this new party of four Sisters who finally reached Penang on 28 October 1852.

From their headquarters in France, they set off for Southampton and when they reached Alexandria, they took a boat down the Nile to Cairo and then proceeded to the Suez in caravans. On the sea again, they found it hard to sleep in the tropical climate. The youngest of them, Sister Gregory was Irish and on the day they boarded the "Indostan", she was in a state of excitement. In her imperfect French, she explained that she had seen an immense "beast" hopping all over the cabin. The others dismissed it as "too much sun" but Mother Mathilde noticed that Sister Gregory was convinced as she kept darting her eyes around the cabin which was lit by a small candle. Soon Sister Gregory was on her knees battering something furiously with her slipper while crying in her basic 20 French, "Mother. Not be afraid. Me killed him. Me give him a great whack," before displaying her victim, "an unfortunate cockroach". Sister Gregory was unhappy to realize that her "big black beast" was not rare or dangerous but the whole boat was swarming with it.

The nuns under Mother Mathilde established a convent in Penang and though they were beset by difficulties on every side - climate, language, customs, poverty, distrust - they set to work with zeal for the glory of God. Two years later, they were asked to set up a convent in Singapore and when they first arrived, they found one bed, two mattresses, two chairs and three stools, a saucepan in which to boil rice and a pot for tea, coffee or curry as the occasion demanded. They also found that there were no doors on their hinges, the kitchen floor was covered with rubble and plaster and the bathroom tiles were nearly all broken. All these drawbacks were waved aside with a smile. Mother Mathilde and her Sisters quickly got to work and within 10 days, they took in orphans, did needlework for the town's ladies to support themselves financially and taught 14 fee-paying children.
