Section G – Comprehension: – Selected Response and Open-ended (10 marks)
Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Have you been told not to sit too near the television? The reason given is that it will ruin your eye-sight. Actually, watching TV close-up or playing computer games for too long will strain your eyes. When this happens, you will feel exhausted and irritable and may get a headache.

You can relieve eye-strain by closing your eyes for a short time. The advertisement breaks during TV shows are a chance to take your eyes off the screen. If you are reading or using the computer, try to rest your eyes for one minute every 30 minutes. You can also relieve eye-strain by looking at an object that is far away or simply getting a good night's sleep. 5

There are many good habits that you can practise daily. For example, make sure you do near-work activity such as reading or doing homework in a well-lit area. If you go outdoors on a sunny day, wear a cap and sunglasses to protect your eyes from the bright sunlight. 10

However, if you cannot see faraway objects clearly, see an optician quickly. He may ask you to wear spectacles. If you have been prescribed spectacles, make sure that you wear them and take care of them. Lastly, everyone is encouraged to visit the optician yearly for an eye check-up. 15
