

His housemaster did not allow him to read all the letters which his parents wrote to him. Roald Dahl's school experiences later became ideas for his stories.

After schooling, Roald Dahl joined a company that sent him to East Africa. In East Africa, he had adventures with wild animals like the crocodiles and snakes and enjoyed those adventures. This was what he had always wanted. Soon World War Two broke out and Roald Dahl volunteered his services in British Royal Air Force as a fighter pilot.
