

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

popular Florence Nightingale was a Victorian woman born in 1820 to a very renowned family. She was named Florence by her mother as this was the city of Italy, in which she was born.

Remembered dearly for her contributions to nursing, Florence was nicknamed, 'The Lady With The Lamp'. A pioneer in the nursing field, this remarkable woman was also an accomplished author and mathematician. Many people who read her biographies were always surprised when they learnt about this.

To pursue her love for nursing, Florence Nightingale went against her wealthy parents' wishes. Society judged it to be a job not suitable for a 1 person of her background.

During the war, Florence formed a team of thirty nurses and travelled to the field hospitals to serve the injured soldiers. Her biggest shock was the extremely poor hygiene standards of the hospitals. This factor contributed to the slow healing and poor health of the already injured soldiers.

Holding a lamp, Florence visited the wards late through the nights to keep a constant check on her patients. She administered medicine and changed bandages of the injured soldiers.

Florence was recognised for her perseverance to greatly improve medical care for injured soldiers. Her efforts reduced the death rates of soldiers dying from diseases by two-thirds!

The Queen of England rewarded Florence by presenting her with a prize money of \$250,000 and a royal brooch, famously known as the 'Nightingale Jewel'. Florence kept the brooch and used the money to 25 build a hospital.
