The word waste refers to something that is left after use, unnecessary and no longer useful. For a long time, people have a habit of throwing waste, believing that they no longer have value. Indeed, we live in a 'throwaway' society and it can be all too easy to throw leftovers into a bin as they will be collected and disposed of. However, most kinds of waste are far too valuable to throw away. Metal waste, whether from households or factories, certainly falls into this category.

Metal is one of the four main components of household waste. The others are paper, glass and organic matter such as food scraps. In total, metals make up around nine percent by weight of household junk.

There are various ways to deal with waste. For example, it may be buried in the ground or burned. Whatever we do with waste, it cannot just disappear from the world as if by magic. 10 Buried waste may be out of sight, but it could still lead to other possible problems. The leaking of poisonous substances into the soil is one such problem. The burning of waste may also be problematic as gas and smoke will be released to pollute the air we breathe. The best possible solution is to recycle waste by using it again in another form.
