## Reduce, Reuse and Recycle!

Did you know that what you think is common trash items can actually be recycled to make musical instruments? You can make a simple musical instrument using an empty shoe box in five easy steps. Try it and then groove to the music!


### Make a Guitar

What you need:

- > a large empty shoe box
- > eight paper clips
- > four rubber bands
- > marker pens
- > sticky tape
- > a pair of scissors
- > two cardboard rolls (from the inside of kitchen towels)







#### Instructions:

- 1. Cut out a big-hole on the cover of the shoe box. Then use the sticky tape to tape up the cover to the box.
- Make five small holes on each side of the box, using the tip of a pencil.
- Push the paper clips through each of these small holes and attach a rubber band on each clip. These will be your guitar strings.
- 4. Tape the two cardboard rolls together. Tape them securely to the top of the box. You will hold on to this part when you play your guitar.
- 5. Decorate your personal guitar using the marker pens. Make it as attractive as possible and strum away.

You can also make other instruments like bongo drums from plastic containers and maracas from tin cans.

Have fun with your instruments and save your environment at the same time!!

# Section G: Comprehension 2 (8 marks) Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

An ambulance was rushing a patient who had suffered a heart attack from his home in Bishan Road to Tan Tock Seng Hospital. As there was a traffic jam on the Central Expressway, the ambulance, went onto the road shoulder to overtake other vehicles.

The driver of a Toyota car then followed closely behind the ambulance on the road shoulder. He wanted to get past other vehicles and avoid the traffic jam.

Mr Ong, a paramedic who was in the ambulance, took a video of the incident and posted it on his Facebook account so that people could watch the video online.

Those who saw the video on Facebook were upset with the driver of the Toyota car and wanted the police to deal with such irresponsible drivers. "I put the video up to remind reckless drivers not to drive closely behind an ambulance. There are patients fighting for their lives," said Mr Ong.

An officer from the Traffic Police told reporters that sometimes drivers of vehicles fail to give way or challenge the ambulances by speeding dangerously on the roads. "Some drivers park their vehicles right behind the ambulances, making it impossible to open the back door to load the patient," he said.

All such cases will be referred to the Traffic Police at Ubi Road for investigations. The driver of the Toyota car could have committed an offence of driving on the shoulder of an expressway. Illegal travelling on the road shoulder carries a fine of up to \$80.
