Like many children his age, seven-year-old Justin Khoo loves ice cream and video games. However, he is involved in something unusual on weekends.

Justin spends Saturday afternoons with his parents befriending the lonely elderly residents who live in a block of rental flats in Lengkok Bahru. 5 Justin sings songs and helps organise sing-along sessions. He even goes door-to-door with his father to distribute food items such as bread, fruit, oats and cookies.

Mr Khoo has found a simple way to ensure that his son learns to care for the elderly. He does not want Justin to spend his weekends 10 playing video games or attending birthday parties.

One Saturday, Justin and his classmates visited and distributed food at the same block. Justin's cousin, Luke, who was invited to join them, was so moved by what he saw that he asked for donations instead of birthday gifts on his eighth birthday. He raised one thousand dollars for 15 the elderly residents.

Mr Khoo set up a volunteer group after visiting the block for the first time four years ago. "I was just shocked at how little food they had," he said. "I knew I needed to do more for them."

The group is made up of mainly friends and relatives. They buy 20 food to give to the elderly. Volunteers also organise walks around the neighbourhood for them.
