Steve Jobs was an American businessman and inventor who played a key role in the success of Apple computers and the development of revolutionary new technology such as the iPod, iPad and MacBook.

From a young age, Steve's adoptive father, Paul, encouraged him to experiment with electronics in their garage. This led to a lifelong interest in 5 electronics and design.

In primary school, Jobs was bored and often played pranks. His teachers reported that he was a handful to teach. Later, he went to Reed College in Oregon, but dropped out after six months. He had taken up calligraphy at Reed and said that it influenced his interest in design and the 10 eventual use of elegant fonts on Apple computers.

In 1970, he was introduced to Steve Wozniak. Together, they created the first two Apple computers. Apple's first logo had a picture of Sir Issac Newton sitting under an apple tree. Next came the rainbow striped apple with a bite taken out on the side. Later, it was simplified to a single colour. 15

Through Apple, Jobs was widely recognised as a charismatic pioneer of the personal computer revolution and for his influential career. Although he passed away on October 5, 2011, he continues to be fondly remembered by his peers, hailing him as a genius and genuine innovator.
