I was only thirteen that bright summer afternoon, but what my father said to me then has often come back to me in vivid memory.

A tall, skinny girl shaped like a pipe cleaner, I was poised on the diving board of a bavside resort near our home in Connecticut. It was Regatta Day.

I had reached the finals in the diving contest. The other finalist had just dived into 5 the lake. She was not only a splendid performer but also one with the proportions of a contemporary Venus. I noted with dismay that she was now getting all the applause - all I was getting was nettled. The whistles and cheers that greeted her as she emerged from the water betrayed the appreciation of more than a good dive. I felt miserable and inadequate to the competition.

At that moment, with everyone's eyes upon me, the key button on my bathing suit popped off! Instead of asking for time out to change into another suit, I used the incident as an excuse to guit. Holding my suit to my chest, I jumped off the board feet-first into the water and automatically forfeited the contest.

My father, who was waiting for me in a small boat even before my dive, pulled me 15 in. He said without preamble, "Rosalind, you're going to have to learn one thing: A guitter never wins and a winner never quits!"

My father never had to repeat those words.

"A guitter never wins," I muttered while trying to prove myself the equal of the neighbourhood boys. I broke my leg jumping out of a treehouse, sprained my wrist falling 20 off a high wall and twisted my ankle tripping over a kerb. However, I got a stubborn sort of satisfaction from doing my best.

One day, ten years later, I was in a dingy New York rehearsal studio. I was taking a dancing lesson, trying to prepare myself for a musical-comedy role. The routine was so difficult I felt I would never master it. "I'm afraid this tempo is too fast for your long legs," the teacher said impatiently.

I blushed angrity, picked up my jacket and started to leave, when suddenly I remembered that moment on the diving board. I put my jacket back, took my place and

practised until my feet were almost numb. In the end, I mastered the dance.

Like most simple truths, my father's words took on more profound meaning than 30 ever. After I had reached Hollywood and had achieved a measure of success, my career took a turn for the worse. I was continually cast as a career woman even though I felt my real future lay in comedy. No one would let me try any other role.

One afternoon, I felt I could no longer stand the frustration. I went to confront my producer. "I've played this role umpteen times and I'm sick of it," I protested. "I have no 35 chance to learn anything more from it. Please let me try another role." Unfortunately, he was not listening.

Then I got my chance as a comedienne. Time and again I had begged for a certain role; finally, to quieten me, a test was ordered. I played the part four different ways, as the director instructed. Then I said, "May I play it, just once, my way?" 40

'My way' was a characterisation I had worked on for weeks before my dressing-room mirror, even though I had been assured that I would never get a chance to play the role. When I finished the test, the director said, "Ros, you've got something." He gave me the part of Sylvia in '*The Women*'. It **established a whole new career** for me. Not only was I no longer typecast, I received a steady stream of offers for comedic roles.
