

The 3.2 kilometres long Singapore River has been the lifeline of Singapore for more than 150 years. Many of the early settlers first set foot in Singapore on the banks of this river. Most of these people were Chinese, but there were also Indians and Malays. Some set up businesses while others lived around the vibrant waterway.

Singapore's free port status and strategic location attracted all types of trade. The river's calm water, ideal for trading activities, served as the harbour for the growing British Settlement. In the 1970s, littering caused by squatters, hawkers and manufacturing industries which crowded the banks of the river, led to severe pollution of the Singapore River.

This promoted the 'River Clean-up Campaign', which began in September 1983 and saw the last few small boats on their final journey out of the river. Today, converted bumboats operate as river-taxis which carry sightseeing passengers. The Singapore River has also become the venue to many public events and activities including the Lunar New Year 'River Hong Bao', Annual Duck Race and fishing competitions.




