The world comes together every four years to watch perhaps the greatest sporting event, the Fifa World Cup, or simply the World Cup, an international tournament which connects people from across the world, regardless of background. Federation Internationale de Football Association (Fifa), the sports' global governing body, was founded in 1904.

Prior to the World Cup, there were numerous other football competitions. The first international tournament, the British Home Championship, took place in 1884. As football grew in popularity in other parts of the world, Fifa was determined to stage an international tournament in its own right. In the 1908 Summer Olympics in London, football for amateurs became an official 10 competition. This led to Fifa successfully staging its own international tournament outside the Olympics. With the President of Fifa, Jules Rimet, as the driving force, in 1930, Uruguay was chosen as the host country for the inaugural World Cup Tournament. Uruguay was celebrating its centenary of independence and went on to win the inaugural tournament. Since the 15 inaugural tournament, nineteen World Cup tournaments have been held and won by eight different national teams.

One cannot speak of the tournament without the mention of the World Cup Trophy. The Jules Rimet Trophy which was what it was first known as, was stolen not once but twice. It was first stolen in 1966 during a public 20 exhibition but was later recovered in South London. However, it was never recovered when thieves took off with this trophy in 1983.
