For the first ten years of my life in Hong Kong, my elder sister and I had to share a room while my two brothers had their own rooms. My elder sister and I knew in our hearts that we were both viewed with contempt by the rest of the family. We were both girls and everyone considered me to be a source of bad luck because my mother had died giving birth to me.

My elder sister was like a mother to me. She paid the greatest attention to everything about me. Most of all, she cared about my education and checked my homework every evening. Whenever I got a good report card, she would lock it in her drawer and wear the key around her neck, as if my grades were precious jewels which were impossible to replace. She also encouraged me to read and soon I developed a 10 passion for writing. I used to scribble kung fu stories in a special notebook and would bring them to school. It thrilled me to show my stories to my classmates and watch them giggle.

When I was thirteen years old, my father told me that I was to leave school at seventeen and get a job because he no longer wished to pay for my education. I protested but it was no use. Desperate to go to university, I begged my grandfather, Ye Ye, to 15 negotiate on my behalf. On one of my rare visits home from boarding school, the whole family had got together for dinner. After dinner, Ye Ye cornered my father and they had a private conversation. Afterwards. Ye Ye related that my father had been unsympathetic. My father had said that a daughter should never be too well-educated because it would spoil any slim chance of getting married. According to him, no sane man would ever want a bride 20 with a university degree.

I was terrified, remembering how my elder sister never finished secondary school and was forced into an arranged marriage at the age of seventeen. Fate intervened in the nick of time in the shape of a writing competition I had entered some months previously. Unknown to me, my name was in the newspapers for having won first prize. This convinced 25 my father to send me to England for higher education.

Several years later, in England, while waiting for medical school to start, I applied for a vacation job as a clerk in a small firm. Over the phone, the manager gave me directions to his firm and asked if I was ready to start work that day. As soon as he saw my Chinese face, however, his attitude changed. Avoiding my eyes, he told me that the position had been filled. The manager was a nice man because I could hear the embarrassment in his voice as he repeated the **lie**. He probably knew that I would be a good worker and he was reluctant to let me go. His rejection did not devastate me because I knew that I would be able to find similar work elsewhere.

Throughout my studies in England, I knew in my heart that if I remained there, I 35 would not be given the same opportunities as my English classmates. After graduating from medical school, I went back to Hong Kong. To my shock and dismay, my colleagues resented me because I was a graduate of an English rather than a Hong Kong medical school and I spoke with a strange accent like a foreigner. No matter how hard I tried to please them, I remained an outsider.
