Since she was a little girl, Jean Wendell had a special rapport with animals. However, in the two years since her family brought Sunny Boy home to their fam in Louisiana, the 16-year-old had bonded more closely with her horse than anyone had expected.

Abused when he was a young colt years before. Sunny Boy was spooked 5 by almost any human contact. "No one could ride him," said Jean's Dad, Mark, "but my daughter had an immediate calming effect on him that allowed her to saddle him up for a ride." Sunny Boy and Jean quickly became inseparable.

At the local Redbud Festival Parade in March 2008, the whole Wendell family — Mark, his wife Bobbi, Jean and her younger sister, Kristen — decked ¹⁰ themselves out in Western gear and trotted on their horses behind the parade contingent's commander. Jean rode Sunny Boy and Kristen was on her pony, Angel. As the parade made its final round in the city square, a 75-pound pit bull shot out of the crowd, making a beeline for Angel and began to attack her. When Angel moved away in panic and tried to kick the dog away, Kristen quickly jumped ¹⁵ off the pony to avoid being thrown off. The snarling dog then turned on Kristen. Seeing this, Jean dismounted to protect her sister.

"We watched in horror," recalled Mark. When Jean let go of the reins, Sunny Boy was very nervous and neighed in fear. Then he acted as if he was going to run off. However, as the pit bult dog whipped around to pounce on Jean, all 1,200²⁰ pounds of Sunny Boy bolted across and he jumped between them. He astonished everyone by squaring off and kicking the dog hard in the face. "I was shocked," said Jean. "Usually, he avoids other animals."

The tenacious dog flipped around and raced to another horse. It began snapping and tearing gashes in the legs of Mark's horse. Chaos reigned until 25 animal control officials moved in and finally captured the dog, which was later euthanised. Jean's friends clustered around her, exclaiming, "Your horse saved you!" Looking back on the incident. Mark described the behaviour of Sunny Boy as

highly unusual. "I've been around horses all my life and have not seen a horse take 30 on another animal like that," Mark commented. That night, Jean visited Sunny Boy out in the pasture. "I gave him treats and told him how thankful I was that he had protected me. I think he already knew how I felt."

Sunny Boy, the unlikely hero, participated in an equine-assisted therapy programme for troubled youths later in the year. Without a doubt, he remained as 35 Jean's hero for many years to come.
