At that time, Disney worked with another young artist in an old building. There, they often saw mice running in and out. So, they drew a cartoon mouse. Their cartoon mouse was not exactly a real mouse. It stood on two legs like a human, had big eyes and ears, and wore white gloves. The artists called him Mickey Mouse. It was the start of Disney's fame and he continued to create unique characters such as Donald Duck, Goofy, Peter Pan and many more.

Always coming up with new ideas, Disney created a theme park with rides and entertainment based on his movies. Costing \$17 million, Disneyland opened in 1955. The park was a huge success and remains one of the most popular holiday destinations in the world.
