

Hydroponics is the method of growing plants in water. Usually, chemicals
are added to help the plants to grow. Instead of using a big piece of land, this
type of farming does not use too much (33)
Hydroponic hobby kits have become popular in many homes. With the
help of these kits, vegetables like spinach can be harvested after six to eight
weeks. Fruits such as watermelon and honeydew need (34)
time. They are usually harvested after three to four months.
A hydroponic kit normally takes up no more than one square metre and is
best placed in the balcony. Each kit (35) a styrofoam box,
sponge pads for holding the plants, a seedling tray, seeds and nutrient solution.
The price of a kit ranges from \$36 to \$400.
