



Black and white stripes make the zebras one of the most recognisable animals in the world. The Plains zebras are the most famous of the three species of zebras, living in the grasslands of Africa. The other two species are Grevy's zebras and Mountain zebras. Plains zebras also have a different stripe pattern unlike the other species. They have underbelly stripes.

Zebras are smart animals. With a keen sense of hearing and excellent eyesight, they are able to stay clear of predators such as lions and cheetahs. If a zebra spots a predator, it lets out a sharp two-syllable call. The young and female zebras run, while the males trail behind to defend them. If one is attacked, others circle around to help protect it from predators.

Zebras are also herbivores. They spend the majority of their day eating, mostly grazing on grass. To keep up with the frequent grinding of the food they eat, their back teeth continue to grow throughout their lives.

Zebras are known to travel great distances to find food and water when the dry season arrives. When not eating or travelling, they do take the opportunity to sleep.
