



Polar bears are the world's largest tand predators. Wild polar bears can be found in Alaska, Canada, Russia, Denmark, Norway and the Arctic. Each of these places either banned hunting or established rules on the number of polar bears that can be hunted within their own boundaries. These rules help keep polar bear populations stable. Today, 25,000 to 40,000 polar bears roam the Arctic.

Around the age of four or five, female polar bears can start having babies. They usually only have two cubs and they have these babies in a cave they have dug in a large snow drift. They stay in the cave over winter and come out in spring with the babies. The cubs are much smaller than human babies when they are born. They are the size of a rat and weigh a little more than 400 grams. They can grow to the size of a full-grown man within a year if they are supplied with plenty of food.

Despite what we think, the fur of a polar bear is not white. Each hair is a clear hollow tube. Polar bears look white because each hollow hair reflects light. On sunny days, it traps the sun's heat and keeps the bear warm at 36 degrees Celsius when they are resting. The fur of a polar bear is also oily and waterproof. The hairs do not matte, allowing the polar bears to easily shake free of water and any ice that may form after swimming.

Many people believe that the polar bear is at risk of becoming extinct because of global warming. When the ice disappears, there is no place for polar bears to rest after they are done swimming and searching for food. Research has shown that by the year 2050, the population of polar bears will decrease by two-thirds.
