Most people probably link coyotes, which look like wolves, with Western America. Indeed, these handsome and adaptable animals are native to that part of the world. However, over the past hundred years, the species has greatly enlarged its territory. It has moved steadily eastward and into areas that are more densely populated. Today, the melodious howls of coyotes can be heard throughout the United States of America and in parts of Northern and Central America.

Why have coyotes been so successful? Their omnivorous eating habits certainly have helped them. They are known to eat just about anything, including insects, snakes, grass, apples, cactus fruit and even watermelon. Coyotes also prey on livestock. For this reason, some people seek to reduce their numbers or even eliminate them altogether. Ranchers have long felt hatred toward the coyotes because the animals kill hundreds of sheep each year. In turn, ranchers and hunters kill thousands of coyotes annually by poisoning, trapping and shooting them.

People living in the cities may also feel worried about the presence of coyotes. A hungry coyote may attack and kill a pet cat or dog. Yet there is also reason to commend coyotes. They play an important role in maintaining the balance of nature. Their preferred foods are rats, gophers and other small rodents. Without coyotes to keep their numbers down, 20 these rodents would do enormous damage to the crops.

Can humans and coyotes share a common living space? To what degree they would be able to exist in harmony remains to be seen. Meanwhile, this wily animal that Native Americans call the Trickster continues to thrive.

We were fortunate that two teenagers responded to the emergency. They swam towards Lily while we watched with anxiety. Till today, I feel that the ball had been deliberately guided in its speed and flight path to ensure my sister's rescue. I believe an angel was watching over Lily that day.

The incident turned out to be a blessing in disguise. It prompted Lily to take her swimming lessons later on in primary school very seriously. My sister is now an excellent swimmer and she represents her school at national 40 competitions. When reminded of the incident, she would deny with a cheeky grin that it had ever happened.

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
