Part 9: Comprehension Open- Ended (10 marks)

Read the passage carefully and answer questions 51 to 55.

Button quails originate from India, China, Southeast Asia and Australia. They are noisy, active and hardy. They are the smallest of the quail species. They can be kept indoors or outdoors but must be sheltered from the rain if placed in the garden aviary as they cannot tolerate damp conditions.

To keep them healthy, the adults must be fed a diet of seeds, fresh greens, mealworms and crickets. Once a week, vitamin supplements must be added to their water. Also, their drinking water must be changed daily.

Unlike other birds, they have feet that are made for walking rather than perching. So, the flooring of their enclosure should not be made from wire. Wood shavings or other soft surfaces can be used to make the flooring instead. As button quails tend to be shy, they like to have places to hide within their enclosure. They are also easily startled and may fly straight up instinctively. As such, the roof of the enclosure cannot be too hard as well.

Newly-hatched button quails are called chicks. They are extremely small and require special care. To prevent their drowning in water containers, marbles should be placed in a shallow dish. The added benefit is that the chicks tend to peck at the marbles and hence, end up drinking more water.
