Police will put up signs at the sites of serious or fatal accidents to ask witnesses for contact them. The move is aimed at getting witnesses to come forward with information about the accident.

The first sign was displayed by the Traffic Police after a fatal accident involving a ninety-year-old woman recently. Police put up the sign about twelve hours after the accident to appeal for witnesses. Within two days after the sign was put up, the Traffic Police received information from a member of the public. Soon, the driver of the pick-up truck was detained.

The sign displays easy to read information with graphic, such as the date and time of accident, whether it was serious, fatal or a hit-and-run accident, the parties involved and the contact number of the police. Hence, responsible people should do their part by providing information regarding accidents or other crimes to the police. Any information is valuable to the police and it can greatly make their job easier in solving accident cases and crimes.

The signs could also prove to be useful in warning motorists, especially those who speed along the roads, and careless pedestrians to be more alert and careful when travelling along the same stretch of road.

The police have assured road users that the signs would be placed in such a way that they would be visible but not distracting to motorists and pedestrians.
