I have read much about it in books and magazines, in addition to hearing my grandfather's accounts of its construction. After driving for a while in Kobe, a

"Koji, you'll soon see the great Akashi Kaikyo Bridge," my grandfather said.

major industrial centre in southern Japan, our car entered a highway along the coastline. That allowed me to take in a full view of the world's longest bridge. I 5 felt dwarfed by the monstrosity of its size, wondering how much steel and

concrete the suspension bridge has in its mass.

Stretching over the Akashi Straits for about two kilometres on pillars rising to a height of 30 metres, the Akashi Kaikyo Bridge is indeed a sophisticated engineering feat. According to my grandfather, it is able to withstand powerful waves, strong winds and even violent earthquakes. He knows the bridge very well. After all, he was involved in the ten-year-long project to build it. In 1987, two years after the government surveyed the site for the bridge, my grandfather was appointed as the chief engineer in charge of erecting its pillars. One of his colleagues designed the bridge. Another supervised its road development.

Turning around, I saw my grandfather gazing out of the window. I could sense from his silence the gamut of emotions in him. Apart from pride, he also has other attachments with the bridge. Memories of friendships, sacrifices, achievements and challenges must have occupied his mind. He has mentioned to me his regrets of neglecting the family as he dedicated his heart and soul to making the bridge a reality. It often separated them for months, with his wife and children in Osaka while he worked in either Awaji or Naruto.

My grandfather broke his silence when the driver stopped to pay the toll to cross the bridge. I allowed him to indulge in explaining to me that the government collects a fee for usage to settle the cost of constructing the bridge 25 despite being aware of the reason. We soon found ourselves above the sea. If not for my defective camera, I would have taken a photograph of the bridge on my first experience of travelling over it.
