The 1995 Rugby World Cup was memorable. The tournament favourites, England and Australia, were knocked out in the qualifying stages. On June 24, 1995, South Africa defeated New Zealand in the finals of the Rugby World Cup in Johannesburg, South Africa, while a special guest looked on. He was Nelson Mandela, the first president of South Africa to be elected 5 in a fully representational democratic election the previous year.

In 1994, Mandela, who had spent 27 years as a political prisoner of the South African government, declared that "the time for the healing of the wounds has come". Over the course of his five-year presidency (1994-1999), he dedicated himself to building understanding and forgiveness between black and white South Africans. Blacks were traditionally excluded from 10 the rugby team and as a result did not support the national team. Mandela's appearance at the rugby game, in spite of the national team's exclusionary history, was an effort to help heal the nation's wounds.

The 1995 World Cup final pitted South Africa's *Springboks* against the New Zealand *All Blacks*. Both teams came into the match undefeated, and were widely thought to be the two 15 best teams in the tournament.

A drop goal by South Africa's Joel Stransky broke a 12-12 tie in extra time, giving South Africa the championship. After the game, Mandela, who wore the jersey of François Penaar, South Africa's team captain, presented the trophy. As Mandela prepared to hand over the cup to his captain, he said, "François, thank you for what you have done for our country." 20 Penaat, with extraordinary presence of mind, replied, "No, Mr President. Thank you for what you have done."

As Zachery Mastoon watched the news report about Flight 292, his eyes filled with anxious tears. "Some of the experts were saying that there could be a loud crash, a large fire," he recalls. "Others were saying it's not a big deal at all. For the 27- year-old electronic musician, he had other concerned as he was onboard the crippled plane, hoping that he would make it home. Concerns

On September 21, 2005, a mechanical glitch on a medium-sized airliner seized the attention of millions around the world. Among them were the plane's passengers who followed the live coverage via satellite TV. Passengers began flipping between the news channels.

The first signal that something was amiss on Flight 292 occurred about 15 minutes after take off when the pilot, Scott Burke, came to the intercom. "For those of you who may have noticed," he said," we are flying in circles. The plane's front landing gear had failed to retract," Burke explained. He would keep everyone posted as he investigated the problem. There were few worries until he flew low over Long Beach Airport. The officials in the airport's control tower took a closer look at the damage to its landing gear before they could attempt a landing. Fire engines and ambulances were lined up below, clearly visible from the aircraft's windows.

Zachery thought, "<u>This</u> is completely out of my control. If I'm going to die, I don't want to spend my last two hours biting my nails." He quickly took out his camera and snapped digital photos of the televised image of the plane. Then he switched to Comedy 20 Central and spent the next two hours laughing. Another passenger, Lisa, tried to call her mother on her mobile phone but could not get a signal. "I was aching to hear her voice. I wrote her a text message saying not to worry. If something happened, I would be watching over her and my brother," lamented Lisa. In row 22, Sam and Janel were talking about their past. Married for 35 years and the parents of three grown children, Sam asked Janel, "If there's anything I have ever done that you haven't forgiven me for, I ask you to forgive me today." In the meantime, the flight attendants were circulating the cabin, giving reassuring words and hugs.

Scott had taken the decision to land the aircraft at Los Angeles International Airport in order to take advantage of its long wide run way and modern safety equipment. However, they needed to lighten the plane so as to reduce the potential stress on the landing gear and dramatically lowering landing speed as well. The plane circled low over the Pacific Ocean for more than two hours in order to burn the fuel and lower the risk of fire upon landing. In the meantime, the flight attendants were redistributing the plane's weight, pushing the hand luggage to the rear and even some passengers to the rear. They were also giving final instructions for the emergency landing. Women wearing high heels were advised to remove them so as to avoid injury if escape slides were deployed. Those carrying ID cards in their hand baggage were advised to place them in their pockets. The passengers smiled and nodded in understanding.

The in-flight video system was turned off well before landing. As the plane began to descend, flights attendants began chanting, "Brace! Brace! Brace!" and the passengers repeated drowning out the sound of engines.
