Asthma is a chronic inflammation of the airways. People with asthma have breathing difficulties. An asthmatic attack results when the muscles in the lungs tighten and the airways are blocked with mucus. Thus, air cannot move freely in and out of the lungs, causing the person to become breathless, cold and sweaty.

Asthma triggers cause asthma attacks. Some common asthma triggers are air pollution, respiratory infections, extreme weather conditions, emotional stress and strenuous exercise. The main symptoms of asthma are coughing, gasping for air, tightness in the chest and mucus in the throat.

Asthma can be difficult to diagnose as it resembles other respiratory diseases but early diagnosis of asthma is important. Asthma cannot be cured but the frequency of asthmatic attacks can be controlled. People with asthma should avoid cold and dusty places and manage their stress levéls as these are the common triggers. However, with proper treatment, people with asthma can be as active as normal people. They can still take part in sports and lead a normal life.


