



Cycling can be quite a challenge to some. From a four-wheeled to a two-wheeled bicycle, balancing plays a major role to allow you to stay off ground. This is very true for the new vehicle that runs on electricity. It is called the Segway, a two-wheeled, self-balancing electric vehicle invented by Dean Kamen in 2003. This **ingenious** invention has indeed taken the world by surprise.

To operate this vehicle, you lean forward to go forward and lean back to go backwards. To turn, you will use a "Lean Steer" handlebar, turning it left or right. Sounds easy? As long as you maintain your balance, it needs little effort to travel anywhere in this vehicle.

However, like every new product, there are always faults, be it minor or major. When it was first launched in 2003, approximately 6,000 Segways were recalled due to a defect which caused the vehicle to stop suddenly when the batteries ran dry.

There were also other faults. Users have had accidents when their vehicles stopped suddenly, jerked unexpectedly or failed to properly respond to controls. These caused them to lose balance or get knocked off the vehicle. Injuries sustained included neck and back injuries, brain injury as well as fractured arms or legs.

Segways are now in-built with the maximum speed limit, depending on the country's specifications. In some countries, they enforce the Segway owners to be licensed before they can ride the vehicle around. Some countries have even banned such motorised vehicles from the sidewalks so as to prevent any accidents. Helmets are also a must if you ride on one.

All in all, Segways are still an easy mode of transport, as long as the users take the 2 necessary training and precautions.




