Dengue fever is a serious, flu-like disease which is spread from person to person through a germ transmitted by the Aedes mosquito. The mosquito becomes infected when it sucks the blood of a person who has the dengue virus.

After about one week, the mosquito becomes a carrier of the virus which 5 can infect a healthy person by biting him. Dengue cannot spread directly from one person to another – it needs mosquitoes to be the carriers.

Unlike normal short-lived fevers, fever caused by dengue can last up to seven days. A patient experiences uncomfortable symptoms like headaches, body aches, joint pain, loss of appetite and vomiting. The additional appearance of rashes is a clear sign that the patient has dengue.

The number of cases of dengue has risen sharply over the last fifty years.

Every year, there are now approximately a hundred million cases worldwide.

The disease is common in warm climates in built-up areas, such as cities and town, where lots of people live. In Singapore, there are about six thousand 15 cases a year.

Aedes mosquitoes like to lay their eggs in pools of stagnant water found in or near people's homes. Vases, flower pots and roof gutters are breeding grounds only if they contain stagnant water. A few mosquitoes in one household can produce enough eggs to cause a large dengue outbreak affecting lots of 20 people. At present, there is no cure for dengue and the most serious form of dengue can kill.
