

Most spiders have poison glands and fangs in their jaws. They use their fangs to inject poison into their prey which are mainly insects. This poison can paralyse an insect and the helpless insect is then **devoured** by the spider.

Spiders usually have silk glands located beneath their abdomen. They secrete a liquid that is thicker than water from these glands. When the liquid comes into contact with air, it dries into a strand of silk. Many spiders use this silk to spin webs to trap their prey and to make cocoons that protect their eggs. Did you know that spiders have their own private jets? This amazing silk is also used to create lines that spiders hang onto as they float or ride in the wind to travel to new areas.
