

Hummingbirds are the tiniest birds in the world. They have amazing speeds and unbelievable colours. The Aztecs used dead hummingbirds for earrings and made entire cloaks out of their skins. As the skins are tough and pretty, they are often used for ladies' brooches, hat ornaments, and flower-type arrangements in the Victorian era.

These amazing stunt pilots are fascinating creatures with the most rapid wingbeats of any bird and a heart rate of up to 1, 260 beats per minute. The most impressive thing about hummingbirds is their energy. If a man weighing about 80kg wanted to live the life of a hummingbird, he would have to burn 150,000 calories a day and lose 45kg of perspiration per hour!

Rumour has it that the inventor of helicopters observed hummingbirds in flight. Both helicopters and hummingbirds can hover, take off, and land vertically. Both also fly sideways and backwards. Hummingbirds rotate their wings in circles, enabling them to fly in any direction. Choppers fly with rotating blades, but *they* are unable to fly upside down like the hummingbirds sometimes do when being attacked.

Despite their quick beating wings, hummingbirds are not the fastest flying birds. These skilled fliers also have difficulty walking – they can hop a little, but need to use their wings to move, even when they are on the nest. With beaks like swords and tongues like extra-long straws, they power themselves on nectar, 20 visiting up to 1000 flowers a day. Hummingbirds also feast on spiders and strain gnats while in mid-air.

Plants that depend on hummingbirds for pollination seem especially made for them. Their blossoms project out to prevent the birds from entanglement in leaves and vines. Trumpet-shaped flowers accommodate their long beaks. 25 Although hummingbirds have no sense of smell, other feeders are not enticed because these flowers lack fragrance.

Hummingbirds have colour vision similar to humans and are not good singers, managing only chirps, squeaks and twitters. Their magnificence lies in their colour. Their feathers are iridescent, with the colours changing constantly depending on the light source and the angle of the viewer. These amazing creatures make their appearances in a variety of places. If you ever spot them, do not miss out on a spectacular air show!
