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One morning in 1843, Sojourner Truth put all her belongings into a pillowcase and left New York. She believed it was her duty to tell people that slavery was a terrible wrong. Since God loves all people, he did not mean for anyone to be the slave of another. That was the message this brave woman wanted to bring to her listeners.

Sojourner Truth soon became one of the most prominent lecturers in the country. It was an incredible feat for an uneducated woman who could neither read nor write.

In the nineteenth century, women were not expected to make speeches in public. Most people felt that it was a job for men. Due to prejudice, most people 10 also did not listen to black speakers. Sojourner Truth had a double handicab but she managed to overcome it. The simple sincere message, delivered in her low booming voice moved her listeners. She became one of the best-known women of her time. During the next 40 years, she spoke to thousands of people in 21 different states.

Sojourner had it in her to be able to speak to crowds of whites. She was a fighter. When an angry mob threatened to burn down the town hall where she was scheduled to speak, she refused to back down. She told the mob that if they burnt down the hall, she would speak upon the ashes. The angry mob backed down and her lecture went on as scheduled.

Another time at a country meeting, a group of hoodlums invaded her tent where she was giving a speech. They were wielding clubs and sticks and started scaring the people away. All left except one. She walked up to the young men and started to sing a hymn in her powerful voice. The hoodlums surrounded her. She told them that she meant no harm to anybody. The young men were stunned. One of them asked her to sing the hymn again and she did. She sang her song and the young men retreated into the darkness, never to bother the gathering again.

It was Mother's Day so our little church was packed. At the door, an usher asked, "Are you a mother?" There was an awkward silence. My arms were already full with my four-year-old son's coat and a diaper bag. I made my way to the pew where my husband and parents were seated. There were no surprises in the programme, I thought.

However, this year, a well-meaning Sunday school teacher had come up with a better idea. She asked each child to draw a picture of his mother and she made them into slides. After each song, a slide of someone's mother was shown and the child who had drawn the picture was handed the microphone. "This is my mummy driving the car," a girl cried out. A picture of a happy mother with a smiling redcrayon mouth, looking out of a car window, flashed on the screen.

The drawings varied in details but all were sweet and tender. I could barely wait. I knew my son's drawing would be wonderful — his mother standing in a field of flowers. I was somewhere in the middle of that fantasy when I heard Owen bellow, "This is my mummy, Susan, washing clothes when she first gets up in the morning." The audience roared in laughter at the drawing on the screen. Owen added, "But I didn't get her hair right. It sticks out more than that." How I wished a hole would open up and swallow me up. "Is this how Owen sees me? Should I have jumped out of bed earlier to dress up?" I wondered.

Before I became a mother, I used to be very certain about motherhood. When my sister-in-law brought her children to my house, they were crawling under the piano, I told my husband that this would never happen to my children. My children would be engaged in some interesting games instead. Now, 14 years into motherhood and having had a few children of my own under the piano, I have come to realise how naive I had been. Motherhood is a good humbling experience. I have learnt much and derived a few suggestions on parenting as well as general life. After all, what are children but small people?

One should always listen to one's children. When I was a child, my Aunt Lois always listened to us children no matter what kind of questions we had. She would look us in the eyes and repeat the question to ensure that she understood it. She always made us feel important. From my husband's colleague, I learnt the truth. Carol was an excellent parent of four. After her divorce, she realised that she needed the children as much as they needed her. They learnt to rely on one another. She discovered that her children were her best friends and allies. In the

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past, I would always rush to answer the phone when it rang, afraid that one of my children might pick it up and say the "wrong" thing. Nowadays, I see them in a totally different light. To me, they are capable and bright people. I am immensely proud of them.

I now have Owen's Mother's Day drawing framed and hung in the laundry room. It is one of my favourite pictures because I realised that it was drawn innocently by a little boy who loves his mother despite her hair standing up.
