One fateful morning, the sound of rumbling thunder boomed across Mount Everest Base Camp. Esther and I looked across at one another in the team's communal dining tent. Sensing something amiss, we went out to take a look. It was not thunder. A huge mass of snow had slid off one side of the mountain, causing an avalanche! A cloud of snow formed where the avalanche had landed. The relaxed atmosphere at the camp became fraught with tension. The radio crackled continuously with talks of a rescue operation. 5

Two Austrian climbers and their local guide were making their way down to Base Camp when they were caught in the avalanche. The snow pushed them down the slope and they hit several rocks along the way. Luckily, they had their helmets on. The couple was later found by rescuers hanging upside down on a cliff, with only the rope between them holding them together. One of the Austrians later showed us his bruises, which were spread across his torso. He could not remember much as he had momentarily blacked out. **The Austrians were lucky.** Their local guide could not be found! Another Canadian climber and his local guide who were on their way to the summit, were spared when they hid behind an ice block which shielded them from the impact of the avalanche. The Canadian recalled how suffocated he felt when the snow whirled around him. He later pulled the plug on the climb and took a helicopter flight out early. 10 15

After witnessing the rescue operation and coming to know about the first death that climbing season, we became increasingly uneasy. We decided to split into two groups to avoid putting all our eggs in one basket. That afternoon, the leader of our group, whom we had engaged to climb Everest, told us something which I had no wish to hear. He said, "You ladies had better reconsider if you want to continue the climb later." 20

"But we are already here, fully prepared and raring to go!" I shot back. I was seething with anger. We had prepared for months for this climb.

But I began to question if climbing Everest was worthwhile. The time spent away from my family had taken a toll on me. I remembered how my father nearly died from dengue fever when I was away on another overseas climb. It was on my birthday when he was admitted to hospital. Thinking that he would not see me again, he was in tears as he sang me the birthday song over the phone. I sensed something was wrong. He was trying too hard to show that he was happy and I asked if everything was fine. It was only after I had returned from my trip that my mother revealed the details of the crisis. My father was hospitalized after 5 days of high fever and my brother had to scramble to source for blood donors. I was upset at not being there when my family needed me the most. I cared for my family deeply, yet I was not willing to give up achieving my goal of being in the first women's team from Singapore to climb Mount Everest. While it was natural to be afraid, I was not willing to let it discourage me. 25 30 35

"Let's do this!" I said. I took a deep breath and headed towards the summit with my teammates.

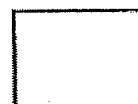
