Earthquakes

Earthquakes are one of the most devastating natural disasters Man has had to experience. They are also among the scariest as they can happen without warning. They also cause terrible destruction to the cities we live in, causing cracks in the ground and landslides.

Earthquakes are the cause of other natural disasters like tsunamis. Thus, a city that is left suffering from one catastrophe can be faced with another minutes later. Haiti faced such a tragedy in 2010. What was worse is the fact that tsunamis rarely occur in the Caribbean Sea where Haiti lies. The people were unprepared for the double disaster. The cities are still being rebuilt but slowly due to corruption. Many people still live in tents six years after losing their homes despite global charity drives.

We in Singapore may feel that we are safe from such natural disasters. We are surrounded by islands which protect us from tsunamis. Though we do not live in an earthquake zone, many people live in high-rise housing. The tops of tall buildings sway at even the slightest tremor in nearby places. While those who live nearer the ground may not feel a tremor, those who live higher up may feel a moment of giddiness and experience the shock of seeing their hanging lamps swinging from side to side.
