To support the abandoned children they had taken in, the sisters began sewing for rich clients. They made clothes for the European ladies and were able to earn a steady income that way. The sisters also received donations from the public.

The number of children grew <u>drastically</u> after the Japanese Occupation and the sisters found (20) it difficult to take care of so many children at once. Despite the sisters' best efforts, some babies did not survive. Those who did, however, entered the convent school and received free education.






