



Section F: Comprehension (10 marks)

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

There are many endangered animals in the world and the cheetah is one of them. Cheetahs are the world's fastest land animals. They live in the grasslands of eastern and southern Africa as well as parts of Iran.

Cheetahs have several special and interesting features that allow them to reach top speeds. They have a powerful heart and large lungs. Their small body 5 frame is lightweight and suited for running fast. With long legs and a flexible spine, cheetahs can cover 7 metres in one stride. Running this quickly takes a lot of energy. Due to this reason, they try to get as close as possible to their prey before starting the chase.

Camouflaged against the tall grasses, they quietly sneak up until they are 10 confident to attack. They then burst out and use their tails to help them keep their balance while making sharp turns. When the cheetahs reach their target, they use their front paws to trip them. The preys are attacked with a bite and dragged to a hiding spot before other predators come by. These include lions, leopards or hvenas.

Cheetahs are sometimes confused with leopards. However, they can be differentiated by their small and flat head. Unlike leopards, cheetahs cannot roar but they can purr and chirp. They hunt during the day as they have poor night vision. They also cannot climb trees.
