It was a dark evening in my Uncle Karim's yard and I was 15. My family and my neighbours used to gather there to watch plays and films on the television set. But the crowd was different that day; it was larger and noisier and everyone was upset.

Then I turned to the television and saw that two hijacked planes had been deliberately flown into New York's tallest towers. I could see people screaming in fear as ambulance sirens wailed in the distance and smoke rose all around. It was September 11, 2001. Most of the crowd gathered that night in my uncle's yard cursed the terrorists.

It was the first time in my life that I had seen New York City. I saw its people and its shining buildings. Reporters were stopping people on the streets and asking them to share their stories of the attacks. Their expressions, body language and the sound of the American accent impressed me so much that I made up my mind to practise hard and learn English. I knew it would be a great challenge since I lived in a small rural village in Northern Bangladesh. Most of the villagers there were illiterate and did not understand the importance of sending their kids to school, let alone the value of learning English.

Over time, with a lot of hard work, I began to read, write and understand English well. Eventually, I was appointed to the post of Junior English teacher at a private English school in Dhaka.

To find some of the largest flowers in the world, one must find themselves hiking through the humid jungles of Southeast Asia. From there, you must be lucky enough to stumble across the plants known as Rafflesia. It produces flowers that are over 1 meter in diameter and weighing as much as 11 kilograms. It is the largest individual flower on the planet.

Even more bizarre, these plants produce no stems, no leaves, nor any true roots. They exist entirely as a network of cells on a group of grape vines until they flower.

So, why produce such large flowers? Well, existing solely within a vine makes it hard to reproduce. By growing very large and producing a foul smell, the Rafflesia attracts insects from far and wide.

Sadly, many species within this family may be lost before we ever get a chance to get to know them. Forests throughout this region are disappearing rapidly to make room for expanding populations and agriculture. As more and more forests are cleared, we could be losing countless populations of these wonderful and intriguing plants. As with large mammals, it would seem that the world's largest flower may become extinct because of human development.
