Children are no strangers to digital gadgets such as smartphones. They have more options for reading than ever before.

Reading from a digital gadget is more convenient because a handy, slim device can hold numerous books. It also has exciting features such as a built-in dictionary, and even a read-aloud capability which can enhance a child's reading experience.

However, studies showed that reading from digital gadgets generally discourage deep reading and recall of information which are the foundations of reading. There is also a tendency to just browse for information when reading, rather than read slowly and carefully. This leads to superficial reading.

In addition to that, the actual feel of a book has more importance than we realise. Readers make connections to the book when they flip the pages. They can also follow the words with their fingers and that provides the reader with a sensory experience that cannot be replaced with digital reading.


However, reading on both types of mediums must still be encouraged to instill a love for reading in children. In fact, a recent survey shows that the percentage of children who read digital texts has increased steadily. Parents can take advantage of this trend. Frequent reading of digital texts can ignite a love for reading which can later be transferred to print reading.
