Head lice make themselves at home on the human scalp, eyebrows, and eyelashes. They are annoying parasites.

While nestled close to the scalp, the lice feed every few hours on a steady supply of human blood. Head lice do not spread diseases, but they can cause itching. This often must be treated with medication. 5

Head lice go through three life stages. Females may lay 50 to 150 eggs on hairs and the scalp. The eggs can resemble dandruff – small white pieces of dead skin cells on the scalp. After about a week, they hatch and release nymphs, which are roughly the size of a pinhead. After another week, the nymphs grow into adults that are about the size of sesame seeds. A louse has 10
six legs and each leg contains its own claws that attach firmly to one's scalp. This is why head lice cannot be removed easily.

Head lice often spread from person to person by direct head-to-head contact. You can also get head lice by sharing personal items with an infested person, such as combs, pillows and clothes. 15

With a constant supply of nourishing blood, an adult head louse can live on a person's head for up to a month!
