Section C: Comprehension 1 [10 marks]

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

A new litter of otter pups has been spotted frolicking with the Bishan otter family. At least six pups have been spotted, bringing the total number of members in the famous Bishan family to sixteen, veteran otter watcher, Jeffery Teo, told The Straits Times.

Richard Lee took photographs of the new pups and he posted them on Facebook. He said that he saw seven new pups but one was believed to have died since.

With the main objective of providing a better understanding of the otters, otter community page, OtterWatch, launches talks to help the public learn about the otters and their living environment. It also discusses how the public has responded to these mammals as their population increases.

Online stories of the otters have drawn many comments from readers who have expressed concern at the growth of the population which has grown up to more than sixty now, as told by National University of Singapore biology lecturer, N. Sivasothi, who heads OtterWatch. However, he stressed that the growth of the otter population depends on the availability of food and competition for food.

"Pups are lost during movement between locations, individuals are killed by traffic and entanglement, others disperse in search of new territories and mates," he said. He further added, "Reduced prey availability due to rising population will limit litter size and growth, which is why otters, like other carnivores, defend their territories against other otter families."

Mr Sivasothi noted how the Marina Bay otter family has lost its battle for territory to the Bishan otter family. They are now being pushed beyond their territory and losing at least two pups in this territorial battle.




