





Princess Alice of England was born deaf in 1885. She learned to lip-read at a young age and could speak several tanguages. She later married Prince Andrew and moved to Greece. They had four children and she communicated with them in sign language. Despite being disabled, Princess Alice was not discouraged.-Instead, she served God by helping people because she 5 believed that it was God's purpose for her to do good works.

Over the years, Greece had suffered much through several wars which brought hardship to her people and to the royal family. Still, Princess Alice did many charitable works and helped the poor. Unfortunately, her husband left her and she had a nervous breakdown. Immediately, she was sent to a mental 10 hospital against her will. She did not even get a chance to say goodbye to her children. Her youngest son, nine-year-old Philip, was shocked when he returned from a picnic and found his mother gone.

After she was discharged from the mental hospital, she worked with the Red Cross which was an organisation that provided food and shelter for orphaned 15 children.

Princess Alice died in 1969 with no possessions as she had so generously given everything she had to the poor. To this day, she is remembered as a kind woman who lived out her faith through her good works.

His mother cooked for him, cleaned up after him and took him to his enrichment classes. She doted on him so much that she even bought him an iPad so he could enjoy playing digital games. Soon, David's mother realised that she was able to complete her household chores without interruptions from David because the iPad kept him so occupied.

By the time he was six years old, David was spending more than seven hours a day on his iPad. He became so engrossed in digital games that he lost interest in all the other activities while refusing to do his homework. Consequently, he did badly in school.

David's parents knew that they had to do something to help him. They 15 decided to take away his iPad. David reacted badly to the confiscation. He was easily irritated and his parents could not calm him down. He also became moody and could not pay attention in school Over time, his behaviour started to deteriorate. Things became so bad that his parents took him to see Doctor Nicholas who was well-known for treating addiction among children. He explained 20 to David's parents that too much screen time would damage a young child's developing brain and it is irreversible.

David's brain had been so badly affected that he had become a "digital addict". His parents were devastated. David had to be enrolled in Doctor Nicholas' counselling programme for six months to help him manage his addiction.
