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In 1883, an engineer named John Roebling was inspired by an idea to build a bridge connecting New York with Long Island. However, experts throughout the world thought that that was an impossible feat. Roebling could not ignore the **vision** he had in his mind. He knew deep in his heart that it could be done. He just had to share the dream with someone else. After much persuasion, he managed to convince his son, Washington, an up-and-coming engineer, that the bridge in fact could be built.

Working together, father and son developed concepts of how it could be accomplished and how the obstacles could be overcome. With great excitement and inspiration, they hired their crew and began to build their dream bridge. The project started well, but when it was only a few months underway, a tragic accident on the site took John's life. Washington was also injured and was left with a certain amount of brain damage, which resulted in him not being able to talk or walk.

"We told them so." "Crazy men and their crazy dreams." "It's foolish to chase wild visions." Everyone felt that the project should be scrapped since the Roeblings were the only ones who had the know-how. In spite of his **handicap**, Washington was not 15 discouraged and still had a burning desire to complete the bridge. His mind was still as sharp as ever. He tried to inspire and pass on his enthusiasm to some of his friends, but they were too daunted by the task.

As Washington lay on his bed in the hospital room, with the sunlight streaming through the windows, a gentle breeze blew the flimsy white curtains apart and he was able to see the sky and the tops of the trees outside for just a moment. It seemed that there was a message for him not to give up. Suddenly, an **idea** hit him. All he could do was move one finger, so he decided to make the best use of it.

By moving his finger, Washington slowly developed a code of communication with his wife. He touched his wife's arm with that finger, indicating to her that he wanted her to call the engineers again. Then he used the same method of tapping her arm to tell the engineers what to do. It seemed foolish but the project was underway again.

For 13 years, Washington tapped out his instructions with his finger on his wife's arm, until the bridge was finally completed. Today, the spectacular Brooklyn Bridge stands in all its glory as a tribute to the triumph of one man's invincible spirit and his **determination not to be defeated by circumstances**. It is also a tribute to the engineers and their teamwork, and to their faith in a man who was considered mad by half the world. It stands too as a tangible monument to his wife who for 13 long years decoded the messages of her husband and told the engineers what to do.
