





NDP 2018 TICKET APPLICATION OPENS FROM 23 MAY

- 1. Singaporeans and Permanent Residents who wish to apply for tickets to the National Day Parade (NDP) 2018 can do so from 23 May to 3 Jun 2018. Applicants can choose to apply for two, four or six tickets to Preview 1 on 28 July 2018, Preview 2 on 4 August 2018, or NDP on 9 August 2018.
- 2. Applicants may apply for tickets via one of the following modes:
 - a. Internet Simply log on to the official NDP website at www.ndp.org.sg and fill in all the fields as prompted on the screen before submitting the application form.
 - b. Short Message Service
 Go to 'Create Message' under the SMS function of your mobile phone, key in your details in the format below and send it to 71715.
 <NRIC No.>SPACE<No. of Tickets>SPACE<NDP/P1/P2>SPACE<Hp No.>
 - c. Email Email to the customer service officers at <u>tickets@ndp.org.sg</u>. Include your name, NRIC no., number of tickets required and your contact details.
- 3. The ballot results are final. There will be no appeals.
- 4. If an applicant uses more than one mode to make an application, only the latest application will be entered for e-balloting when the application period ends on 3 June 2018.
- 5. Each ticket admits only ONE spectator. Children, inclusive of infants, must hold a valid ticket to be admitted to the parade.
