Wilbur and Orville Wright were American inventors of flying. In 1905, they built and flew the first fully practical airplane.

During Wilbur and Orville's childhood, their father would often buy small toys for his children. One day, he brought back a small model helicopter. It was made of cork, bamboo and paper, and powered by a rubber band to twirl its blades. Fascinated by the toy helicopter, the two brothers developed a lifelong love of building aeroplanes and flying.

When they grew up, the Wright brothers followed the research of German aviator, Otto Lilienthal, closely. When Lilienthal died in a glider crash, the brothers realised they had to depend on themselves to continue the research. Then, they decided to start their own experiments with flight.

They set to work trying to figure out how to design wings for flight. They observed that birds angled their wings for balance and control, and tried to copy this. When they added moveable wheels, the Wright brothers found they had the magic formula. In 1903, they succeeded in flying the first power-driven airplane.

Wilbur and Orville set out for Europe, where they hoped they could sell their invention. In France, Wilbur made many public flights, and gave rides to many people. The Wrights sold their airplanes in Europe, before returning to the United States in 1909. With their invention, travelling to another country has become much easier.
