



There are many strange creatures on land and in the sea that are still a mystery. Some of them seem to come from another time. They are rarely photographed or filmed but many people claim to have seen them.

One such creature is Nessie, the Loch Ness monster. It is the most famous lake monster in the world. Many people have reported seeing Nessie, starting from four hundred years ago in 5 Loch Ness, Scotland. There were some false reports made by people who thought they saw Nessie but were mistaken. However, others have lied to become famous or make money. Many tourists come to Loch Ness to try and see Nessie, hoping to take photographs.

The first newspaper story about Nessie was in 1933. Mrs. Mackay was driving along the lake when she spotted something enormous moving in the water. A year later, Dr. Kenneth 10 Wilson took one of the most famous black and white photographs of Nessie. There was no better photograph till 1977, when Doc Shiels took some colour photographs of the monster. Unfortunately, some of these photographs were lost or destroyed. This has often happened with other photographs of Nessie.

Many scientists agree that there is some kind of living thing in the lake. The unknown 15 creature is humongous and has a long neck. However, till now, no one has proven it is a monster that lives in Loch Ness.
