Section H: Comprehension (Open-Ended) (10 marks). Read the passage carefully and answer questions 40 to 46.

'Project I Am' – an organisation to help the homeless - was started by an eight-year-old boy, Jackson, as well as his parents. Jackson's interest to help others first began when he helped his aunt to distribute food to the homeless people in his hometown. Upon seeing many homeless people, he was not only depressed but also baffled. Unable to contain his curiosity, Jackson asked his 5 parents, "Why are there so many homeless people? I thought everybody has a house to stay in. Can we give every homeless person a house?"

"Son, I don't think **that** is possible," his father replied. Upon hearing that,
Jackson was disappointed as he really wanted to help the homeless people. To
show that he cared, he would always donate his pocket money to the homeless
people whenever he saw them on the street.

Seeing how insistent Jackson was to help others, his parents helped him think of a plan. Since many people were already donating food, Jackson and his parents wanted to do something different. They decided to give out free Blessing Bags which contained hand-warmers, socks, wet wipes, hand sanitisers, 15 toothbrushes and toothpaste.

The first experience of distributing the bags was memorable for Jackson. For the very first time, he felt like he was making a difference in someone's life when he saw the recipients' happy faces. He realised then that it was easy to forget how the basic items in the bag could help someone. These 20 were items that someone living on the street would need which others often took for granted. He was inspired to do more.

Subsequently, Jackson's parents helped him turn his small project into something big, and that was how 'Project I Am' started. Over time, more people, even strangers, began to contribute items to put into the bags. Since then, Jackson 25 has helped over 30 000 people in his community and beyond - and his dream to help others keeps growing, one Blessing Bag at a time.
