It was a clear January night in 2003. French yachtsman Olivier De Kersauson was sailing across the Atlantic when his boat, *Geronimo*, mysteriously came to a halt. He was puzzled as he did not turn off the engines of his boat. There was no land for hundreds of kilometres, yet the mast rattled and the hull shuddered as if the boat had run aground. Through a porthole, he saw a giant squid, nearly nine metres long, wrapping itself round the boat. Just as quickly, the creature unhooked itself from the boat and swam away.

Researchers have studied giant squids that have washed ashore. In 2004, Japanese researchers photographed one at a depth of 900 metres in the North Pacific. No scientist has ever examined a five adult specimen up close. In recent years, "squid squads" have invested millions of dollars and deployed scores of submarines and underwater cameras in a race to be the first to do so.

Steve O' Shea, a marine biologist from Auckland University of Technology, was one of the squid hunters. Using small squids, he had been examining the conditions needed to ensure the survival of squids in captivity. He discovered that his previous tank had two lethal flaws: it was rectangular, which, for some reason, caused the squids to sink to the bottom; and it was made of polyethylene, a plastic compound toxic to squids. Since then, Steve had been using glass tanks which are circular to keep his small squids alive.

During Steve's sixth expedition, he faced volatile weather conditions, gusty winds and high waves. He noted that it would be too rough for fishing boats but he needed to look out for container ships on the rough sea as they could come up fast and there would be little time for him to react. After the expedition, he managed to collect a sample of the giant squid. "The sample is beautiful," he said. "But it's the live one that I want," he chuckled.
