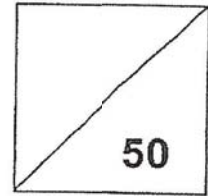

Any neighbour, who could afford a joint of meat in those days, would most likely give the bones to the neighbour's barking dog, in the hope of buying peace for a few hours.

The rag-and-bone man was always donned in his dirty old coat and a white scarf. Why would he wear a white scarf when his neck was thick with dirt? Yet, the white scarf was just about the only thing that was ever clean about him. Instinctively, we treated him with caution and avoided his gaze, though none of us could have articulated the reason for these. His arrival was a signal for us to hurry to the side of the road, leaving our games half-finished. He was not like the milkman, who allowed us to climb onto his cart and let us ride it to the top of the street. On the contrary, the rag-and-bone man wore a perpetual scowl, always looking annoyed.
